### **PENINSULA MUSEUMS TOUR**

3+ hours \$45.00

Columbia Pacific Heritage Museum & Lewis and Clark Interpretive Center

Enjoy the early history of the area at two outstanding local museums. The Columbia Pacific Heritage Museum includes Chinook tribal history, logging, fishing and local community history as well as relics of the Clam-shell Railroad, the only railroad that ran by the tides.

At the Lewis and Clark Interpretive Center, the 4000+ mile journey of the Corps of Discovery, 1803-1806, which culminated at the Long Beach Peninsula and the Pacific Ocean, is on view. The Center also features panoramic views of the ocean from its vantage point high atop Cape Disappointment State Park.



### 'It All Began In A Bog' CRANBERRY TOUR

3+ hours \$25.00

See a harvest of the little red berry as it is happening. A visit to the Ocean Spray facility will include a tour of the inside of the facility, after which there will be an opportunity to tour an actual cranberry bog and watch the harvest process from start to finish. The tour will conclude at the Washington State University Research Facility and Cranberry Museum where cranberry products may be sampled and older methods of cranberry farming observed.

This tour is seasonal and will only include a harvest tour during October.



### CHARTER BOAT TOUR

Lower Columbia River  
2 ½ hours \$75.00

See the sights and hear the sounds on the Columbia River Estuary – by water! A fleet of 8 excursion boats with trained Pacific Northwest Living Historians, allow you to journey along the Columbia River and learn the river's past and present culture.

Embarkation is from the Coho Charter office at the east end of the Ilwaco mooring basin.

Comfortable shoes and appropriate weather-specific clothing recommended. Restrooms are available aboard all boats. Available April through October.



### 'Up, Up and Away' KITE TOUR

3+ hours \$25.00

Take your fancies to the skies! Make and fly your own kite. At the World Kite Museum and Hall of Fame, many of the Museums' collection of over 1,300 kites – including huge dragon kites from the Orient and rare military kites - will be on display and an overview of kiting will be explained.

Then it's time to make a kite and test it on the sandy beach with ocean breezes.

The kite-flying portion of this tour is weather dependent.



### 'Oysters on the Willapa' BAY TOUR

3+ hours \$25.00

Step back in time to the town that oysters built. Walk the cypress-lined streets of Oysterville, once the richest town per capita in the United States, where fortunes were made and lost because of a bivalve. This tour will include the inside of the Oysterville Church, which is still gas lamp lit and heated by a pot-bellied stove. Go next door to the old one-room schoolhouse. From the historically-registered community, visit Willabay™ Oysterville Sea Farms and learn about the oyster harvesting process still going on today. There will be plenty of opportunity to sample oyster products made at the cannery.
